Ruins of St. Paul:

The facade was originally part of the St. Paul's College, built between 1602 and 1640. It was destroyed by a fire in 1835, leaving only the front wall. Locals refer to it as the "Ruins of St. Paul's," and it has now become a pilgrimage site for tourists.





Mount Fortress:

Originally an important military site in Macau, it is now one of China's oldest surviving Western-style fort structures. The Macau Museum, built in 1998, is located at the center of the fort.






St. Dominic's Church:
